Pastors have been gifted with a copy of his book, "Come to the Table" and will receive their copy then, if they have not already gotten it. At 6:30 p.m., Dr. King will lead in a Prayer Summit at Redeemer Baptist Church in Anderson. All church members are encouraged to attend this time of prayer for our churches, association, and the ministries to which God has called us.

Dr. King's biography on Amazon states:

Claude King serves as Discipleship Specialist at LifeWay Christian Resources. He and his wife Reta are natives and current residents of Murfreesboro, Tennessee. After attending school in New Orleans, Claude began work as an editor at the Baptist Sunday School Board in Nashville, Tennessee. After a writer cancellation, he coauthored his first book ("Wise Counsel: Skills for Lay Counseling" with John Drakeford) out of sheer necessity to meet a deadline. He met and began working with Henry Blackaby in 1986. That relationship led to their developing "Experiencing God: Knowing and Doing the Will of God" which was first released in 1990. The popularity of that book led to opportunities to

write others, first with Blackaby and then with a number of other authors. His special contribution to many of those resources has been his style of interactive writing that engages a learner in understanding and applying truths from a message to his or her life. In his current job at LifeWay, he speaks, leads workshops and seminars, and consults with pastors and church leaders to help them and their churches obey Jesus Christ's final command to make disciples of all nations.

Semi-Annual Meeting Review

The Semi-Annual meeting of the East Central Baptist Association was held on Thursday, March 20th, at Integrus Community Church in Albany. Integrus graciously provided food and drinks prior to the meeting allowing for a time of fellowship among the ECBA attendees. The fellowship time spilled over into the scheduled business meeting time but it still started by 7:10 p.m.

Integrus Pastor, Greg Haisley, welcomed everyone and opened with prayer. Moderator, Jim Marlow (North Delaware), called the meeting to order. The minutes were read by Clerk Mary Fullhart (Old Town Hill) and 17 messengers from 6 member churches were seated. Minutes from the November 2016 meeting and the treasurer's report were approved. Pat Storm (Redeemer) presented the 2016 ACP report and stated that we were able to get information from all but 3 of our churches. She noted that completing an ACP was a requirement for being considered an ECBA member church. She also thanked Jim Marlow for his help in contacting churches for their ACP.

Team and committee reports were presented. Sharon Armstrong (Old Town Hill), **Church Ministry Team Leader**, presented their team report. The church ministries include Evangelism, Disaster Relief, Education, and International Women's Ministry. Team Leader, Greg Haisley, presented the **Church Planting Team** report. In the absence of **Church Health Team** Leader, Dana Jones (Faith Community), Mary Fullhart (Old Town Hill), as part of the Church Health Team, presented the WMU/Women's Ministry report. Jama Marlow (North Delaware), **BCM Committee Chair**, shared the Baptist Collegiate Ministry report. Zach Beachy (New Day), **Trustee Chair**, highlighted their report on the sale of the BCM house/ECBA office property. Ron Ross (North Delaware) gave the **Ad Hoc Committee** report. Each of these reports are included in subsequent pages of this newsletter.

The only new business conducted was a recommendation from the Associational Council to have the treasurer place the BCM Capital fund amounts (the proceeds from the sale of the house and unreturned rent deposits) in an on-demand account with the Indiana Baptist Foundation so it could earn interest until such time as a plan was developed for the use of this money; plus, the recommendation from the nominating committee for 2017-18 team leaders and standing committee chairpersons, who will take office following the September Annual Meeting. The nominating committee presented the following names for election:

Mission Constitutes as Remedy City Church



On Sunday, October 30, 2016, Remedy City Church celebrated officially constituting as a church. Remedy City began as a church plant, sponsored by Old Town Hill Baptist Church, in August 2013. They started with small group living room meetings then began meeting on Sundays in June 2014. As the church grew, they moved from living rooms to a small theatre, to a diner with an adjacent conference room then to the youth room, nursery, and classrooms of the Riverside United Methodist Church. After outgrowing these rooms, the Riverside Methodist congregation offered them use of their auditorium, along with their AV equipment, furniture, lobby, part of a closet, etc. They were able to do this by graciously moving their service time forward by 15 minutes. The growth has allowed them to constitute as an entity separate from their sponsoring church and they will become an official member church of the East Central Baptist Association at the Annual Meeting held in September, as per the ECBA constitution.

On Celebration Sunday, several community members, and those who help Remedy City over the last couple of years were invited (such as, landlords, insurance agents, and the friend who connected them with Riverside church). Also attending were North American Missions Board and State Convention of Baptists in Indiana coaches who played a part in Pastor Jeremiah Kinney's church planting efforts. This included Steve Blanchard, Doug Jividen, and John Horn. Remedy City had been averaging attendance in the 40's but for Celebration Sunday, there were over 60 in attendance.

Remedy City Church continues to grow and reach out to the community. Following their service on Sunday, March, 19th, they traveled to Halteman Village Baptist Church where they were able to baptize a new member. Jeremiah said, "it was cool to partner with them to perform that." It will be exciting to see what God will do in and through them in the coming years.

Redeemer Women's Prayer Group Sees God Working

The Redeemer Baptist Church Women's Prayer Group was birthed just a few months ago; but, looking back, we could see that God was directing this even years ago. Leading up to this were a transformed office space, Bible Study, guest speaker, movie, encouragement, and obedience to God.

This past year, the Monday morning Women's Bible Study Group completed the "War Room" study and viewed the movie. A local prayer warrior, Ruth Shinness, visited the group and presented the prayer strategy God had shown her, which involved claiming God's promises and praying Bible verses. This method of praying God's word is effective and powerful. She created a resource book that listed verses topically. "We focus on the answer, not the problem. We are not telling God what we want. We are praying for what He wants for us. We are praying His Word and allowing Him to orchestrate every part of our lives," Unlocking the Heavens by Ruth Shinness.

After weeks of study on prayer, leader Lucresia Storm then asked a powerful question, "Now what will you do with this?" God convicted our hearts and

we began a prayer time which meets an hour before Bible Study on Monday mornings. The Women's Prayer Group uses Ruth Shinness' book and each week a couple of verses are chosen by the group which fit current needs and praises. The verses are prayed every day of the week with confidence that God will answer. A prayer bulletin board is utilized in the prayer room for praises and requests. We regularly pray for the lost, our nation, the President, our men, children, grandchildren, church growth, family issues, health concerns, and other needs. We praise and note answered prayers with great celebration.

One member of our group, Annette Wapler, is a missionary to France. We recently were able to Facetime with her and pray, long distance, together. That's a 6 hours time difference and about 4,146 miles. God is pulling us together.

This group has grown closer as God's women and they enjoy the close fellowship, caring, and sharing. Some of the women shared these comments:

"Our time is a little bit of coffee and a whole lot of Jesus."

"This group shows commitment, a sincere belief in the power of prayer."

"Blessings and right motives."

"God is leading. We are following."

"What a joy to share our burdens and joys and to get to see God at work in all of it"

God has put every piece of this together.

We've celebrated many answers and look forward with great anticipation to what God is up to next. "...where 2 or 3 are gathered."

Baptist Collegiate Ministry Report

In a recent meeting, the BCM members discussed options for seeking out a BCE. Discussion was held on contacting Southern Baptist Theological Seminary to request a time when the committee could come to the campus to meet with students who are interested in student ministry. An information packet would be created containing requirements for the position, outline over a three-year period, and details for raising funds to become self-supported. This packet would be given to every person who participated in a meeting. One consideration for funding is through gifts from BSU/BCM alumni

Discussion was also held on contacting youth ministers across the state to request their help in creating a database of potential high school juniors and seniors who are planning on coming to Ball State. The BCM members, along with the committee and any other volunteers would plan and prepare a welcome event for those students with the intent on bringing them as members of the ministry. In addition, BSU/BCM alumni would be invited to come and give testimony of their participation while on campus.

The members of the committee were in agreement that the main focus of this campus ministry is to equip its members not only to make an evangelistic impact with the lost while at the university, but also to equip them to take that training and mindset to wherever God leads them upon graduation.

Old Town Hill Celebrates 80th Anniversary

This past November 2016 marked the 80th anniversary of Old Town Hill Southern Baptist Church. In an attempt to share the evolution of the church with the congregation, each Sunday of the month featured a short video which covered 20 years of church and world history. Newspaper clippings were included, along with photos of the church buildings, various ministry events, and photos of the pastors for that time period. Everything from the original 13 founders of the church to the most recent ministry event was included in the video. As a nod to tradition, each Sunday a church bell was rung as a call to worship, followed by a song performed by the choir. The final Sunday capstone was a celebration with a catered din-

ner and gifts. Each family was gifted with a glass ornament with the current church building etched on the front. Each member also received a bookmark noting how many years they had attended Old Town Hill. The verse the anniversary was centered around was Psalm 102:18, "Let this be written for a future generation, that a people not yet created may praise the Lord." This verse was a



reminder that while the growth of Old Town Hill has been magnificent, we must continue to serve our Savior, so that more may come to know Him.



The church began in the 1930's as people moved to the Muncie area from Tennessee and Kentucky. It first organized as the United Baptist Church, changed to the Eaton Avenue Baptist Church and later to Old Town Hill Baptist Church. These transitions occurred as growth necessitated more space and the church had to relocate. The congregation was one of the first to affiliate as the State Convention of Baptists in Indiana in 1958. They are the oldest church in our association and one of the oldest Southern Baptist Churches in the state of Indiana. Bruce Reynolds is the pastor.

Trustees Report

Since our last business meeting, the trustees sold the BCM House/ECBA Office as directed by the Association. We enlisted Tracy Ward with Carpenters Realty to sell the house and originally listed it for \$200,000. After receiving offers of \$120,000 - \$130,000, that brought to light repairs and remodels needed to bring it up to legal rental standards, we reduced the price to \$180,000. We received a cash offer of \$160,000 for the house, which we accepted. The resulting house inspection showed major defects, including a wet basement; previous termite damage that had not been repaired; sill plate, floor joists and band joist deterioration; and questionable viability of the furnace. There were also safety concerns including questionable mold growth and several electrical wiring issues. Fol-

lowing the inspection, the buyers offered to go ahead and purchase the house for the \$160,000 offer minus the cost of a new furnace, which made a \$156,400 sale. The sale minus fees netted \$144,845.62, which was deposited into the ECBA checking account.

Appliances were included in the sale of the house. A big thank you goes to Joe Fox who cleaned out the majority of the remaining furniture items and Jon Nichols who removed the computer and copier and their accessories. The ECBA office furniture was moved to Redeemer Baptist Church. Halteman Village is currently housing the copier and all-in-one computer. Many of the household items were given to the Food Panty at Old Town Hill, to use or distribute to those in need. Disaster Relief Team was able

to take some of the tools to use. The family room sofas and the dining table and chairs were given to Pastor Cedric Anderson who had recently moved to Muncie. The TV was given to Pat Storm. She had offered to purchase it but the trustees determined it should just be given to her. Some of the pastors came and got a few of the library books available. With their agreement, there were several items, such as bed frames, tables and chairs, and books that were left for the new owners. Considering that we had to be out at closing, right in the middle of the Christmas holiday season, things went fairly smoothly.

Ad Hoc Committee Report

The 2017 Ad Hoc Committee consists of members: Cedric Anderson, Amos Rodgers, Brad Storm, Dale Trego, and Ron Ross (Chairman). The committee has met three times since it was formed, and though the meetings have included a wide range of topics discussed, these four areas have been deemed of higher priority:

Communications & Unity

We sense an absence of getting information to the grass-root members of our churches. This has, perhaps, led to a fragmentation in the unity within ECBA. It was felt we should consider publishing THE COMMUNICATOR monthly instead of quarterly. This would require additional hours for our Association's Administrative Assistant, thus increasing her compensation package.

A modified Director of Missions, such as a Pastor to Pastors

Realizing that most of Indiana voted in 2008 for the current organizational format of SCBI work, with such, we

relinquished the Director of Missions in ECBA. The new format originally saw two SCBI employees working in each of the regional areas, but later was reduced to one. As a small association, we now regrettably realize the need for a DOM-type person in our midst. Doug Jividen has served us nobly; however, logistics has prevented him from being involved in the practical issues preventing pastors and churches from grasping the dynamics of identifying with normally accepted SBC polity and procedures.

Discipleship & Evangelism

Realizing that our denomination, years ago, strategically designed/offered the Discipleship Training organization for the local church to educate church members in a variety of disciplines including, Baptist doctrine, Baptist/Church history, cult and world religion beliefs, as well as, practical disciplines such as evangelism, generally speaking, most of these disciplines are not being addressed in most ECBA churches, and that is to our demise.

Our people are floundering because of improper training. We need to urgently address this problem with proven solutions.

Constitutional Change

As new church plants grow and eventually become self-sustaining, they will desire to become part of East Central Baptist Association. Currently, such a situation could take place anytime during the year; however, the only time a petitioning church could be approved for membership would be at our Annual Meeting. The Ad Hoc Committee feels such proceedings should be accomplished at any regular meeting of the association and recommends that Article III. MEMBERSHIP. Section 2. Line 5 should be changed to read: "recommendation to the next (omit word, annual) regular meeting of the Association."

A couple pastors indicated the study was a great personal blessing, as well as a blessing to their people. Though winter has passed, the book of Malachi remains and could prove to be a very beneficial study for you and your church family.
