

ECBA Elects New Officers, Accepts Reports, and Enjoys Fellowship at Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the East Central Baptist Association was held 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 19, 2019, at New Day Baptist Church in Alexandria. The meeting was preceded by a pitch-in fellowship meal.

Moderator, Brad Storm (Redeemer), read Colossians 2:2, prayed, and called the meeting to order then appointed Jon Nichols (Halteman Village) as acting Clerk. There were 13 messengers representing 6 member churches seated for this meeting.

Reports were accepted as presented in the Annual Book of Reports (most reports included in this newsletter). Two of the ten Churches had completed their Annual Church Report and the others were encouraged to complete the report as soon as possible.

Bob Weeks, Team Leader for Church and Leader Development for the State Convention of Baptists in Indiana presented the State Convention report. He emphasized encouragement for Pastors, their families, and their wives. He also charged those present to reach out to Pastors not present to encourage them. Jennifer Hall, President of the Indiana Baptist Foundation, shared the foundation report.

The Association accepted the 2020 budget and elected new officers. Greg Haisley (Integris) was elected as moderator for 2019-20 term and Mike Armstrong (Old Town Hill) was elected as vice-moderator. Jon Nichols retained the positions of Treasurer and Parliamentarian and Pat Storm (Redeemer) remained as Assistant Clerk and Assistant Treasurer. Joe Fox (Old Town Hill) and Don Sweigart (Redeemer) were re-elected for a 3 year term as trustees.

Team Leaders that were elected at the Semi-Annual meeting for this coming year named coordinators and committee members. Jeremiah Kinney (Remedy City) has Whitney Bousman, Amanda Smith, and Joni Thornburg, (all from

Remedy City) serving on the Church Planting Team. Sharon Armstrong (Old Town Hill), Church Ministry Team Leader, noted that she will continue as Evangelism Coordinator, Ron Ross (North Delaware) will serve as Education Coordinator, and Joe Fox will stay as Disaster Relief Coordinator. The International Women's Ministry Coordinator and the Migrant Ministry Coordinator positions remain unfilled. Tami Hubler (New Day) has Brenda Brooks (Redeemer) serving as VBS/Children's Coordinator and Tami will continue as Prayer Coordinator and WMU Coordinator with Carol Mohler (New Day) as assistant. Openings remain for Sunday School/ Discipleship Training, Music, Men's Ministry, and Youth Ministry coordinators.

The Resolutions and Arrangements committee report and the Calendar were both accepted. Later, Pat Storm sent out an email to the churches letting them know that there were several date errors in the calendar included in the Book of Reports and she provided a corrected copy (included in this newsletter).

After the business meeting was adjourned, Craig Patty (New Day) led those in attendance in worship through song. Chris Hubler (New Day) used Ephesians 3:14-21 to exhort those present not to take comfort from those surrounding us as much as from God's love shown to us when we bow before him.

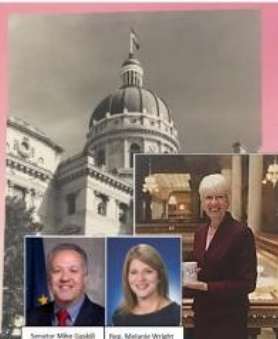

The ECBA Church Planting team is now well organized from an administrative point of view, which makes the association prepared to support planters in intentional and regular ways.

And we have ongoing work taking place by dedicated planters, specifically by the Carpenters (Daleville), the Andersons (Muncie), and the Jameses (Anderson), not to mention the Woodyards (at-large, Anderson)

...consisting of Whitney Bousman, Amanda Smith, Joni Thornburg, and Jeremiah Kinney (chair) met four times.

Administration

We prayed for each of our planters by name at each meeting, and we reached out to them by letter, phone

call, or text (or multiple).

We started the year as a brand new team. The Church Planting arm of ECBA had little by way of recent history or current momentum to pass forward. So we met that by drafting job descriptions, a budget, an application for planters to apply for ECBA monthly support, and a letter inviting planters to request reimbursement up to \$100 for resources. Jeremiah will gladly share those documents upon request.

Planting Progress

We received zero applications returned and zero requests for reimbursement for resources, and so, we disbursed zero dollars.

However, we had one planter family enter our region and make contact with our catalyst and our association, Daniel and Jennifer Carpenter. They are looking to plant in the Daleville/Middletown/Chesterfield area, and

they have been very busy getting to know their community. Also, they pursued NAMB assessment and are working toward goals that NAMB set for them.

Meanwhile, Hope Church in Anderson has recently joined SCBI as an at-large church. We rejoice in the gospel ministry they are doing.

Upcoming goals...

...include remembering planter anniversaries with small gifts, creating a prayer support connection between our churches and our planters, and continuing to reach out to our planters. One small hindrance is the small slice of time that Jeremiah, as chair, can give to actually meet with our planters. This has proven difficult.

Jeremiah would like to give special recognition to his team members who have done a lot of the praying, drafting, and contacting.

training at Redeemer Baptist Church On May 18th, 2019, but cancelled due to lack of interest. Four of our churches reported that they held VBS this summer; Redeemer, Old Town Hill, North Delaware, and Integris. Redeemer averaged 47 children each night and had a total of 61 different children attend VBS. At the end of the week, they donated the VBS decorations and materials to Old Town Hill and North Delaware. North Delaware was able to reach 16 children from their neighborhood. Old Town Hill's VBS was June 23-27. Integris held Vacation Bible School in Albany for the first time in many years. They received their materials and decorations from Living Word Church in Indianapolis then gave their VBS their materials and decorations St. Joe Community Church in Fort Wayne. Overall this has been a very good summer for VBS.

Disaster Relief

The Disaster Relief Team has been busy serving the Lord by helping others this past year. We had 23 people go together to Warsaw, NC, last October then returned in February with 9 people to continue the work there. We shared Christ and prayed with people in Truck Stops, in the homes we worked on, and people who just saw us and stopped to ask us questions. We worked on 15 homes for Flood Recovery.

In June we were called out to help with the destruction from the tornado that hit Pendleton. We worked on 27 properties with 12 DR volunteers. We also traveled to Ellettsville, IN, for 3 days to clean up after another tornado and helped in the Muncie area where there was an isolated storm which produce strong straight line winds that uprooted several trees.

We continue building wheelchair ramps as the opportunities arise and have been able to share the gospel, not only with the residents, but also with their neighbors. In one home in Anderson, we were not only able to build a ramp but also enlarge the bathroom and remodel a lady's home so she could get around in the house better with her wheelchair. Additionally, we worked on remodeling the home of young boy who had cancer, which made it easier to care for him at home. It's not all just about disasters and wheelchair ramps;

it's about helping people in need and sharing the gospel.

This past year our Association purchased an Ford F350 truck for us to use in Disaster Relief. It has been blessing as we continue to use it to help others. Currently, we are using the truck in North Carolina where we have returned to Warsaw this week to continue helping families recover from the hurricane and flooding that they experienced.
